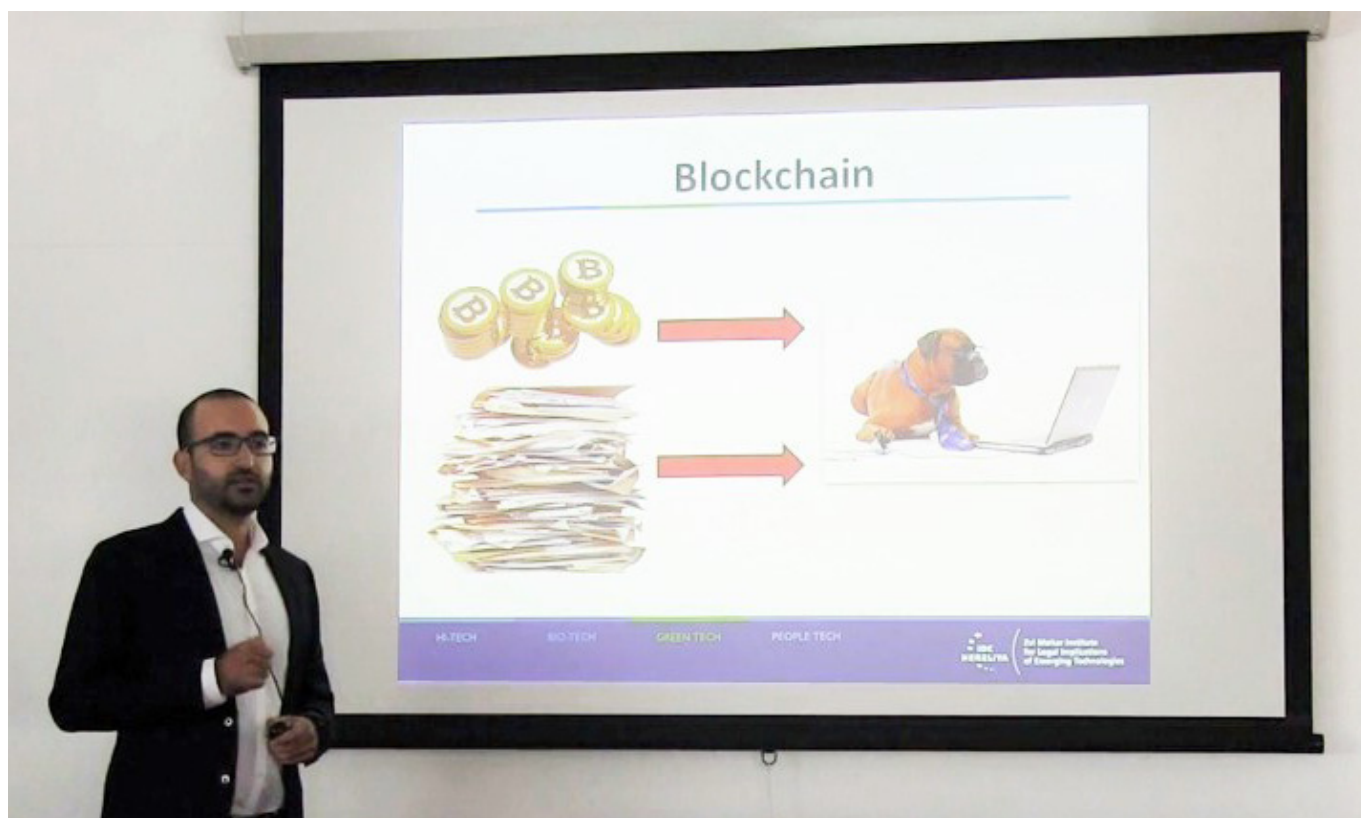


STUDENTS IN ACTION AT ASU
