ONLINE EXHIBITION OF BAMIYAN CULTURAL CENTRE PROJECTS

According to the requirements for transparency inherent in the organisation of an international architectural competition under the auspices of UIA, the Unesco office in Afghanistan, which organised the Bamiyan Cultural Center competition, has published online the 1070 projects that were anonymously submitted to the jury in February 2015. They are available for public viewing over the next three months. After that, they will be replaced with an online chronicle of the great adventure of building the winning project, authored by Argentinian architects Carlos Nahuel Recabarren, Manuel Alberto Martinez Catalan and Franco Morero. The creation of the cultural centre is an initiative by the Afghan government to promote culture and education. The international competition process to select its design added a global architectural dimension to the project as well as insight into contemporary creativity in this area.

WITH MEINHARD VON GERKAN: 4th UIA - HYP CUP

The school of architecture at the University of Tianjin and the Chinese media group Urban Environmental Design (UED), announce the fourth edition their annual international competition open to students of architecture from around the world: the UIA - HYP Cup 2015. The contest is organised with UIA support.

Based on the competition's general theme, 'Urban transformations' German architect Meinhard von Gerkan specified this year's program: 'Place, tradition and modernism in conceptual unity and diversity'. Projects must reflect science in the contemporary world, using culture, geography, landscape and climate of the site as reference points. There are two suggested project sites in China, one in the north and the other in the south. Participants may also choose their own project site.

Meinhard von Gerkan will chair the international jury, with Chinese architect Cui Kai representing the UIA.

HEALTH CARE FACILITIES DALIAN SEMINAR AND STUDENT COMPETITION

The UIA Public health work programme will hold its annual seminar in Dalian, China, from 23 - 25 May 2015. It is organised jointly with Global University Programs in Healthcare Architecture (GUPHA) and will run in parallel to the main congress on hospital construction and infrastructure in Asia. Under the theme 'Health for All', the seminar will examine the cultural, technological, social and operational influences that affect the design and construction of health care facilities.

In conjunction with this seminar, the work programme has launched an international competition open to architecture students requesting designs for a mobile care and diagnostic unit for highly contagious diseases. The competition results will be communicated during the event.

KANVA CANADA'S EMERGING ARCHITECTURAL PRACTICE AWARD

The Montreal architectural team KANVA was selected to receive the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada (RAIC) award for promising young professionals: the Emerging Architectural Practice award for 2015. This award continues KANVA's series of recent successes including: winning projects in two international competitions, one in Winnipeg and the other in Montreal; a prize for excellence in innovation for the urban loft project 'Irene'; and a Grand prix du design for the Edison student residence at McGill University.

Founded in 2003, and led by Tudor Radulescu and Rami Bebawi, KANVA demonstrates architecture's power to transform through a scope of disciplines and scales, from the ephemeral to the institutional. One of the ways they look at their role is as a contemporary master-builder, an artist of the built environment that considers the technology of design and construction as unique process for producing architecture.

FRENCH ARCHITECTS SUPPORT THE TURKISH CHAMBER OF ARCHITECTS

Catherine Jacquot, President of the National Council of the Ordre of French Architects (CNOA), addressed a letter to the Prime Minister of Turkey, Mr. Ahmet Davutoglu, stating the French Ordre of Architect's commitment to the independence of professional institutes as an essential part of their mission of public service to users. This letter was sent to support the Chamber of Architects of Turkey, whose structure and independence have recently been called into question.

This action is in perfect accord with the general policy declaration adopted by the UIA Council (Paris - February 2015) 'to supports efforts to strengthen and increase the effectiveness of national professional institutes, and to enhance their ability to participate in addressing issues of global concern to society and the profession'.

EUROPE RENEWED OPTIMISM FOR THE PROFESSION

The fourth sector-study commissioned by the Architect's Council of Europe (ACE) shows that the architectural profession is growing, flexible, resilient and international. Though the economic context remains difficult, the study reveals a number of encouraging trends and prospects, as well as a renewed optimism within the profession.

Based on responses from 18,000 architects in 26 European countries, the 2014 edition of the study was expanded to include new areas of research, making it one of the most comprehensive studies on the architectural profession in Europe.


